ElevateEdAZ is preparing Arizona students for college and career through stronger alignment between business, education, and the community.

Over the past year, ElevateEdAZ has expanded and is now present in 13 schools across four districts and one charter network, providing an estimated 53,000 student touchpoints. This strategic education initiative is working to increase:


Students pursuing high-wage, high-demand careers



Students earning early college credit and industry-recognized credentials



Students completing internships and job shadows



Educators participating in externships to teach students relevant workplace skills

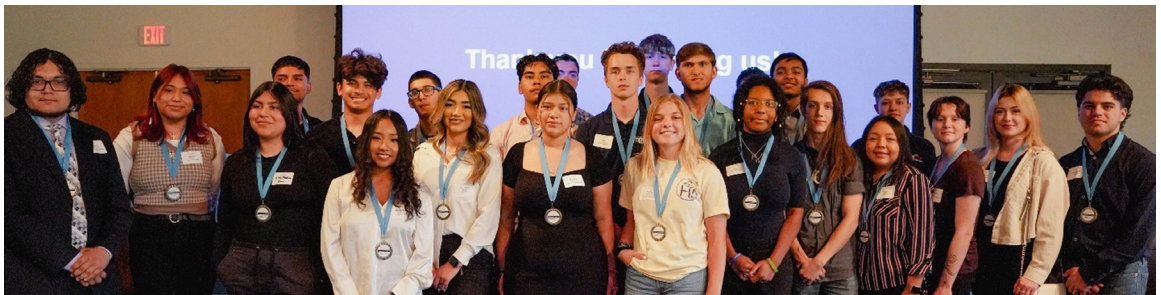

With ElevateEdAZ College and Career Coaches at local high schools, students and teachers received unprecedented support to connect classroom and career!



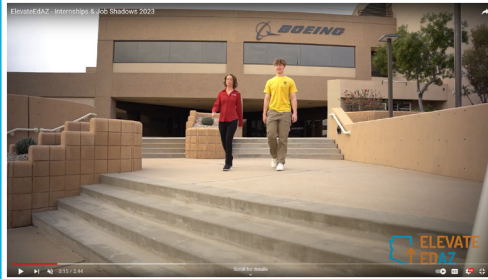

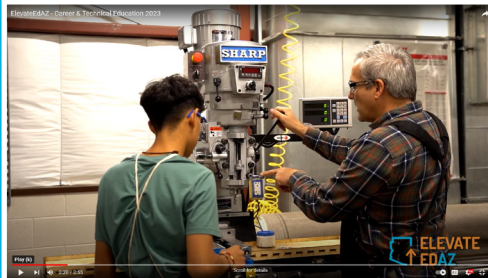

Students share the impact ElevateEdAZ's high school internship program has had on them and how the hands-on experience is helping prepare them to succeed in their desired career pathways.

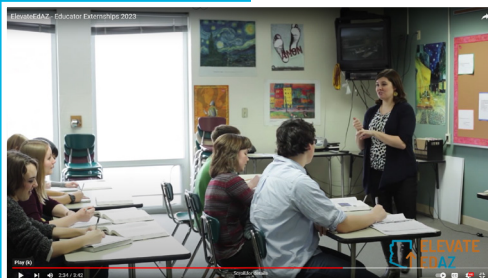

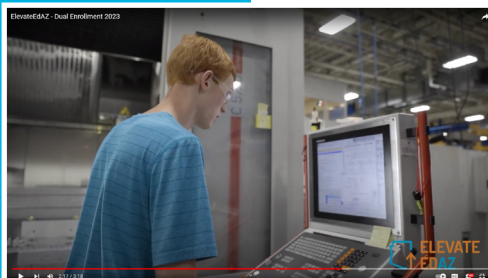
